TWO DIE FROM GASOLINE FUMES

Engineer and Mate of Tanker Die At the Sarnia Wharf.

All Efforts To Rescue Men From Death Were Futile.

SARNIA, April 14.—Roy McDonald, first mate, and Clifford White, third engineer of the Imperial Oil, Limited, steamer Royalite, lost their lives at noon today in a compartment of the hold of the steamer, both men being overcome by gasoline fumes. All efforts at rescue proved futile, as the rescuers were in turn overcome by the fumes of the gasoline in their attempts to reach the men.

Clifford White, according to eyewitnesses, descended into the compartment to release a hose off a heater pipe along the bottom. He pried it off and started to climb a ladder to the top and when he had ascended about eight feet he was seen to swoon and fall off. Roy McDonald, the first mate, witnessed his fall, and immediately descended with a rope to tie around White's body. He got down and managed to place the rope under White, but was unable to secure the knot before he succumbed to the fumes.

Watchman Goes Down.
The watchman, who was standing at the hatchway, also went down to the rescue with a rope fastened around his body and was unable to accomplish anything owing to lack of air and was soon overcome. He called for assistance and Alfred Darlington, a railway fireman, came over and went to the watchman's assistance without any rope. His efforts, combined with the efforts of others who managed to get around the top in an unconscious condition. A hose was then dropped into the hold compartment in an effort to draw the fumes from the bottom, but this was not successful.

James Struthers, 317 Emma street, placing a mask of the army type on his face, then went down into the compartment with a rope, which he placed around White's body and it was brought up to the deck of the steamer. Struthers was almost overcome when he got out. A diver's suit was subsequently secured, and James Struthers, garbed in the suit, went down twice, and in the second attempt was successful in getting out the body of McDonald.

Take Bodies to Morgue.

The bodies were taken to Phillips' morgue, but owing to the absence of the coroner attorney it has not yet been decided whether an inquest will be held or not.

Coroner Dr. William Logie was first on the scene, and Drs. A. N. Hayes and A. R. McMillen and J. F. Sadler were also called. Both McDonald and White were dead when they were taken from the hold. The city pulmotor was telephoned for and was dispatched immediately to the scene of the accident, but was no use. The heads of both men were submerged in gasoline when found. McDonald resided on Essex street, and is survived by a wife and one child, and White resided on Davis street, and is survived by a wife and two children.

MAKE EFFORTS TO OBTAIN RELEASE OF SEMENOFF

Anti-Bolshevik Leader's Attorneys Try to Free Client Who Defaulted Bail.

NEW YORK, April 14.—Attorneys retained by Gen. Gregorie Semenov, former leader of anti-Bolshevik forces in Eastern Siberia, resumed their efforts early today to secure the release of their client from the Ludlow Street Jail, to which he was committed last night on default of bail. It was declared that in a few hours a new bail bond to replace the one cancelled yesterday by the Fidelity and Deposit Company at Maryland would be arranged, and that the Cossack chieftain would again be at liberty.

Several surety companies refused to furnish bonds for Semenov, pleading "patriotic reasons" for their action. As a result, the general surrendered to Sheriff Nagle shortly after 4 o'clock. He declared his occupation was "lieutenant-general," and that he was 32 years old.

A hearing in the bankruptcy proceedings against Semenov by the receiver of the Yurovets Home and Trading Company, which caused his arrest in this city, was called for this afternoon.

FLOOD REACHES HIGH LEVEL

Many Families Around Windsor Have Been Isolated.

WINDSOR, Conn., April 14.—High water in the Connecticut River is making a new record in this town, and on the meadows it has gone back so far that a number of houses heretofore safe, have been isolated. Some families took their cattle upon the house verandas for protection, as the barn floors were covered. It was possible early today to row a boat from the First Congregational Church in Windsor to a rise of land near the Congregational Church in South Windsor.

TRAIN GOES OVER EMBANKMENT

ONAWAY, Mich., April 14.—An entire passenger train on the Detroit and Mackinaw Railway left the rails near here yesterday and plunged down a 20-foot embankment. All but one of the passengers escaped serious injury. The accident was caused by a softening of the track by flood waters of the Black River. The crest of the flood has passed here and similar reports were received from other towns in this part of the state, which were threatened earlier in the week by the high water.

FAMOUS TENOR IMPROVES

Physicians Report John McCormack Has Passed Crisis.

NEW YORK, April 14.—John McCormack, the famous tenor, who was stricken with an affection of the throat here last Saturday, and whose illness became alarming on Wednesday, was declared today to have passed the crisis, but he will not be able to sing again for several months. The physicians in attendance upon the singer asserted the illness would not affect the quality of Mr. McCormack's voice, as the infection was above the larynx.

All concerting arrangements made by Mr. McCormack have been cancelled, and he has given up his plan to leave on May 2 for a tour of Ireland and continental Europe.

LOSES LIFE ON RAILWAY TRACK

E. B. Osborne of Preston Believed To Have Fallen From Train.

Inquest Into Fatality Will Be Opened At Galt.

GALT, April 14.—About 3 o'clock this morning the engineer of a C. P. R. eastbound train noticed the body of a man lying on the tracks about seven and a half miles from the city, and on investigation it was found the man had been killed, presumably by the preceding train going west, the passenger due here at 2 o'clock.

Coroner J. H. Redford of this city was called for, and on arrival on the scene he identified the victim as E. B. Osborne, a well-known and highly-respected retired gentleman of this district, who, with Mrs. Osborne, had made their home during the past winter at Hotel Kress, Preston. The body was badly mangled, a wheel having passed over the chest, severing the head and left arm from the body.

The remains were brought here, and since the accident occurred in Wellington County, Coroner T. Orton of Guelph was notified, and an inquest will be opened here Saturday morning.

It appears that deceased went to Toronto Thursday morning to spend the day. He had intended returning home on the train reaching here at 8:30, but because of its crowded condition waited over for the midnight train, advising his wife by telegram that he would not be home until then. How he met his death is a mystery at present, as he was never missed, but there is no doubt but that he was killed by the train on which he was travelling, as no other had passed.

He was about 62 years old and

was born in Galt a member of one of the city's best-known families of the early days. He left here when young, going to Hamilton, where he spent many years, later moving to Toronto, where he was engaged in the brokerage business. Several years ago he returned to Galt and bought a farm near the city, which he operated until his youngest son went overseas with the Flying Corps. He met his death in an air raid. Major Eric Osborne of Toronto is a son, and Mrs. Stuart of Blair road, this city, is a sister. There also survives his widow. The funeral will take place in Hamilton on Monday.

SPANISH REPULSE ATTACK

Moroccans Defeated in Assault on Miskrella Garrison.

TETUAN, Morocco, April 14.—An assault on the Spanish positions at Miskrella was repulsed by the Spanish garrison, which defended the blockhouses successfully until the arrival of reinforcements, says an official communique. The attackers left 60 dead on the field. The Moroccans are now bombarding Miskrella and the Spanish artillery is replying. Artillery fighting is continuing between the rebels and the Spanish forces in Valez Gomeria.

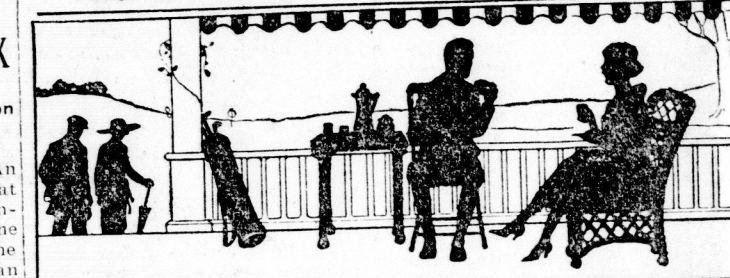
