#### WHY WOMEN VOTE Guide-Advocate Watford, Ont.

The following from the Amended Municipal Act is given in reply to an enquiry re women's votes : Women have the same right to

vote in municipal election as is possessed by men. The Municipal Act was amended in 1917 to read : Every person shall be entitled to be entered on the voters' list who is of the full age of twenty-one years ; a British subject, not disqualified, and rated to the amount mentioned in the Act, viz., \$100 in villages and townships, \$200 in towns, \$300 in towns ex-ceeding 3,000 in population, and \$400 in cities. The rating for income must be in respect of income from trade, office, calling or profession. By an amendment passed by the Legislative Assembly in the month of April, 1919, it is provided that a woman may be elected or appointed a member of the Municipal Council, and may act and vote therein, or may be elected or appointed to any municipal office, or as a member of any board or commission or other body constituted for municipal purposes, in the same manner and on the same terms, and under the same conditions as in the case of a min But where property qualification is required for membership in a municipal council or for any office, the qualification of a woman shall be as owner or tenant in her own right. The qualification for membership of an "urban" school board is, that the person must be 21 years of age, a British subject, and resident in the municipality. For 'rural" school sections, the persons qualified to be elected as trustees shall be British subjects, who are resident ratepavers, and of the full The jazz band idea, according to a age of 21 years.
