

JAMES A. BALLEY'S ESTATE WORTH HALF A MILLION.

LONDON, January 10 — The will of James Anthony Bailey, of the circus firm of Barnum and Bailey, who died at Mount Vernon, N. Y., in April. 1907, was admitted to probate here today. The personal estate of Mr. Bailey in England is returned at \$148,350, and the gross value of his property in America is placed at \$438,591. After deducting bad debts and the expenses of administration, the solicitors say that the gross value of the property will be but slightly in excess of \$500,000. This is less than one-third of the estimated amount of Mr. Bailey's property at the time of his death. The entire property is left to his widow
