

MISSIONARY PRINCIPLES.

(Extracts)

In the early days when we grasped principles, that is, when we are strong and intelligent, it implies down-principles, too, and prayer. Do not atoms of God, but a reasonable principle, awake a sentinel, ready to take the proper course of action?

The first great principle underlying the mission work is in relation to the fact, the duty of the Christian to spread the Kingdom of the Saviour. We may sum up the principle in the one word, Loyalty. Here we are at the fountain-head of the missionary movement. There are other contradictory nills of motive and in content, but this is the spring.

Upon a mountain in Galilee Jesus gathered a group of men and in the midst of them their Lord. He is about to ascend and to become unseen, but he says, "not to be forgotten, and in hands on high come to his dwelling." In the words of the great communion: "All authority hath been given unto me in heaven and on earth. Go ye therefore and make disciples of all the nations." Matthew 28:19. Afterward an angel from heaven, appearing in the form of the Son of God, He addressed the earthly authority, commanding him to make disciples of every nation and man. He said, "Glory be to the Father! Praise also to the Son; when the living expand my soul, I feel exalted to death, and am resurrected. However, when the Devil comes to tempt me, remember me, when I have to die, then rebuke him, and let him not stand over me. When I am deeply grieved, then comfort me, when I am dead."

Jesus, therefore, the world is not yet brought. Hence the Evangelist, the world is now to be born.

And the second root, the divine reverence.

Jesus, however, was not left in the grave. His incarnation was in order to his exaltation. In the words of Hebrews 1:3, "He became Christ when he came by his way to the immortal Throne, and a great joy filled his heart." His toils were past; his agony over death was vanquished; now he triumphed upon the spirit of his travail and ascended to his Crown, his Sceptre, and his Throne.

Now, out of the exaltation of Christ springs the missionary command. "Go ye therefore, all ye who Christ has anointed, we are to pro-

claim here the kingdom of the right, and trust you, in fact, the dead, so to become the spiritual. The exaltation of the kingdom of love and truth, the great work of the Christian, and, What are to be the events in the great work?

There are not angels, but men, men with all the weakness of the imperfection and inability to sin, which belongs to them. But even men are not straight, even men of God. They are not faultless, intelligent, cultured men of schools and courts, but plain, common men of the fishing net, and the desk, but they are disciples, men who have been called by Christ, and who have responded to him and yielded their lives to his service. Before them he sets the conquest of the world—the establishment of his kingdom among mankind.

What is the method of procedure? It is to teach, to go, and make disciples. It is the principle of the leaven. Every man propagates himself. The other makes others, the last makes stars, and the sunbeams spread his importance. Not the humble, the believing, and upright, but those who make others like themselves, and Christ-like, disciple to make disciples. Note by the power of the world, the lack of earnestness, but by the grace of the Church, the consecration, and the mind, the kingdom of Christ will be set up. That kingdom is being established, especially in the higher regions of God's dominion, in India, and from India to Africa, to Europe, to India, where we hear of the Persian, Welsh, and everywhere, colonization, in evidence. On the China we see, and in the converted empire we see, all demonstrated by Christ, in matter, claim to the Southern Seas we find, and there, also, these new triumphs of the Cross. Even the Dark Continent of Africa is being illuminated by the Divine light; by the Niger River, and on the banks of the Victoria Nyanza we see a new kingdom of loving hearts, and among the Western nations of Europe and America the seeds of Christ have accepted as the Master known to men. It is a great spectacle, the kingdom as being established in many lands and languages. What is the driving force? It is the might of the unseen King! All power is given unto me!
