The spring mackerel lishery of last
year in Ircland, according to the Blue
Book on Fisheries, was the largest on
record, yielding 20,250 tons. The
greatest portion was dispatched to
legisland in ice. The creatinder was
pickled for America, and experted in
18,864 barrels. Nover before was so
large a quantity of the Irish spring
mackerel cared for the American market, the chikes of single book of
sometimes dispared of 10,000
to 20,000 fish in one night being recorded.

The antumn mackerel fishery also showed "a very remarkable advance on provious years." A large American fishing schooner crossed the Atlantic to share in this rich fishery, but after dispatching the catch home, was to taily lost on the rocks off Derrynane, County Kerry. This year no American fishers have ventured to follow in the wake of their unfortunate pioneer.

Very Rov. Augustus B. Langlois died last wook at St. Martinerville, La., aged 60 years. Father Langlois was a native of France.
