As in the natural world there are regularly recurring periods, day and night, seed time and harvest, summer and winter, in constant succession, for the service of man's temporal wants, it was fitting and characteristic of Divine wisdom that there should be, as there are, regular periods for labour and rest, and the appointment could only proceed from such a source. The observance of these periods is followed by the promised blessing; their neglect, sooner or later, by evil. Nations disregarding the rule either decay, perish, or exhibit every form of ferocity and vice, and man, individually, is blessed or not, as he conforms to or neglects the Divine com mand.

Let no one among us be persuaded to relinquish our belief, and resign to secular use, a day so consecrated in exchange for a vague theory, however specious, based on literalism and fallacious reason-October 24th. Principus Obsta.




