less than sixty years, and to any female contributor and female whose term of service is not less than thirty years and butors. whose age is not less than fifty-five years, who retires from the Civil Service with the consent of the Governor in Council after giving three months' notice of his or her desire so to retire.

14. The annual retiring allowance to a contributor shall Annual be two and one-half per centum of the total salary received retiring allowance. by him during the last thirty-five years of his service, or if his period of service is less than thirty-five years, then during the whole of his period of service.

15. If any civil servant is not subject to the provisions Half annual of Part I of the Superannuation Act and is ineligible by tion in reason of any limitation of age herein prescribed, to become special case. a contributor under this Act, the Governor in Council may grant him an annual retiring allowance not exceeding onehalf of the retiring allowance to which his period of employment, including any period of employment in a temporary capacity in the public service of Canada, would entitle him had he become a contributor in respect thereto under this Act.

2. The retirement with a retiring allowance of any civil Age limit servant to whom this section applies may, in the discretion deferred. of the Governor in Council, be deferred beyond the age of sixty-five years until he has completed thirty-five years service, but in no case beyond the age of seventy years.

3. Any such civil servant who is seventy years of age Seventy or over at the date of the coming into force of this Act years at commenceshall not be eligible for any retiring allowance unless he ment of Act. is retired within twelve months of the said date.

4. Nothing in this section contained shall affect the Rights not right of any civil servant to whom this section applies. affected. and who at the time of being retired from the Civil Service is a member on the Retirement Fund, to the amount to his credit in the said Fund in accordance with the provisions of Part II of the Superannuation Act.

16. The Governor in Council may reduce the amount Unsatis of the retiring allowance or other benefit payable to a factory contributor under this Act if the service or any part of the service of such contributor has been unsatisfactory or if the contributor is being retired for incompetence or neglect of duty.

17. Every person who receives a retiring allowance upon Evidence of the ground of being wholly incapacitated for the further incapacity required. performance of his duties and is less than sixty years of age,
