II. AWARENESS AND SUPPORT

A. Awareness and Attentiveness Re: Outcome of Free Trade Negotiations

Previous surveys in 1987 show that a majority of Canadians were not following the Canada-U.S. free trade discussions very closely. This pattern has changed in response to the events of early October, with a majority of 57% of Canadians in October saying that they have been following the discussions about free trade with the United States either closely or very closely. Table I shows that despite the majority of Canadians claiming to be attentive to the trade discussions, they are not that familiar with what is contained in the agreement. Almost two-thirds (63%) say they are either "not too familiar" or "not familiar at all" with what is contained in the agreement.
