NATIONAL HOUSING ACT

SUBSTITUTION OF NEW LEGISLATION TO INSURE APPROVED LENDERS, ETC.

**Hon. Robert H. Winters (Minister of Public Works)** moved that the house go into committee to consider the following resolution:

That it is expedient to introduce a measure to be substituted for the present National Housing Act for the further improvement of housing and living conditions and for that purpose—(a) to authorize Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation to insure approved lenders, including banks, in respect of loans made by them to assist in the financing of new residential construction in urban and rural areas; also to insure, under certain conditions, loans for the repair, alteration and extension of existing homes; and (b) to continue and redefine the actual powers of the corporation as to the making of loans, the furnishing of guarantees, and the undertaking of federal provincial projects; also
