Part-time psychiatric services are dispensed at Drumheller, Saskatchewan and Dorchester Penitentiaries. All psychologists and classification officers are employed on a full-time basis. The only inmates who could be considered as receiving psychiatric treatment on a full-time basis are those on register at the three Regional Psychiatric Centres operated by the Canadian Penitentiary Service. The number of inmates considered to be on full-time psychiatric treatment are as follows: (i) Regional Psychiatric Centre (Quebec), 64; (ii) Regional Psychiatric Centre (Ontario), 86; (iii) Regional Psychiatric Centre (Pacific), 95. No statistics are maintained on the other inmates not hospitalized at the Psychiatric Centres who occasionally receive psychiatric treatment on an out-patient basis. No inmates receive psychological or social work treatment on a full-time basis. No statistics are kept on the number of inmates receiving psychological or social work treatment on a part-time basis. Such treatment is given on request, if needed, and when it is appropriate (or on the basis of need identified by diagnostic testing and given to all inmates on admission and when required during sentence) or in relation to observed abnormal behaviour. All inmates receive the services of classification officers from the beginning to the end of their sentence on a part-time basis.
