

Government. To end violence on the picket line, you eliminate the cause of the violence, which is the use of scabs. There was no violence during the rotating strikes—

**Some Hon. Members:** Yes, there was.

**Mr. Angus:**—except when Canada Post started to bring replacement workers in.

We had a strike in Thunder Bay at the Great Lakes Forest Products plant. One thousand five hundred men and women went out on strike, but there was no violence because there were no replacement workers, no scabs. People there understand the system. The Government has to accept responsibility for the violence.

As to keeping the mail moving, I come back to my first point, that if the Government were serious about keeping the mail moving it would have instructed Canada Post that it was no longer bound by the corporate plan, a plan that will not increase service but will lead to a deterioration of service in the communities.

I hope tomorrow during the full debate I will be able to finish my comments.
