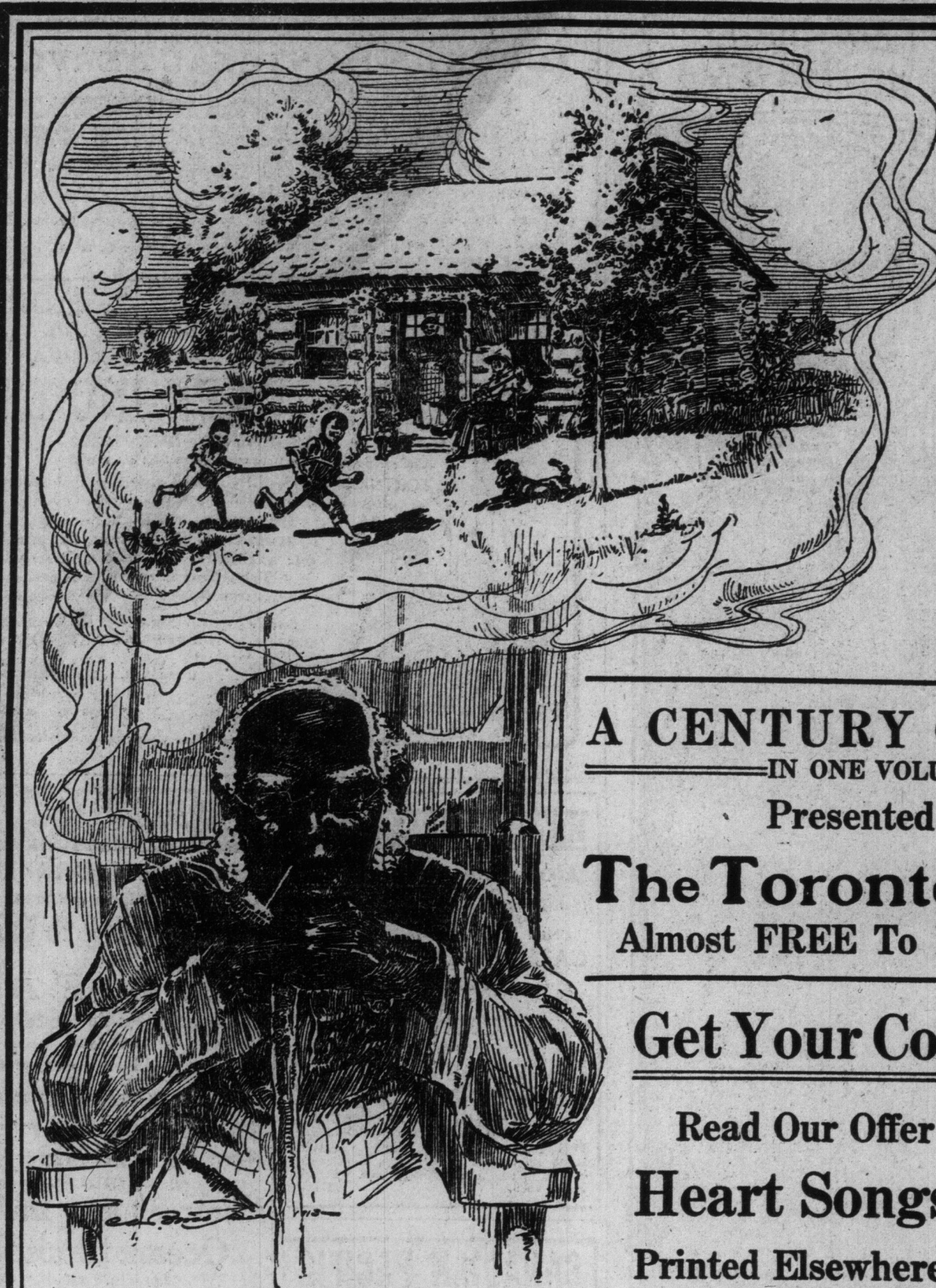

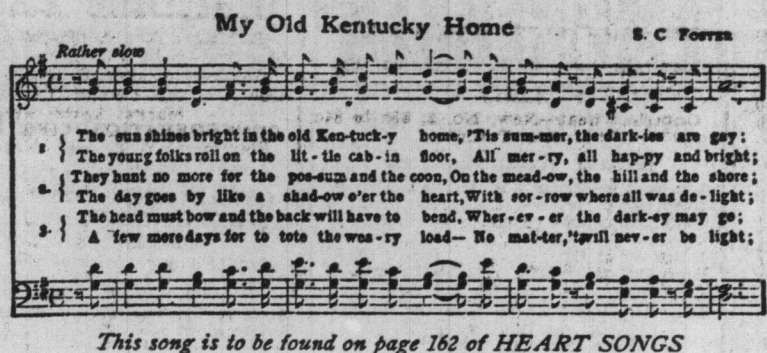

SYNOPSIS OF DOMINION LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 15 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency for the district in which the land is desired. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties: his homestead residence upon and cultivation of the land, in each of three years. A homesteader may live within five miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead, price, \$2.00 per acre.

Duties: must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to clear homestead (patent), and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts, price \$2.00 per acre. Duties: must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.
