INSTRUCTIONS.

The following instructions are requested to be observed by those attending the funeral:—The bands, societies, militia, Battery "C," Royal Navy and the workmen will assemble in the government grounds in the rear of the drill-shed and march through the drill-shed under the command of their respective marshals. The procession will move from the residence at the sound of the bugle at half-past two, and will halt at the bugle sound when the hearse arrives at St. Andrew's Presbyterian church. The procession will stand at ease while the services are being held in the church. At the sound of the bugle it will again move on. When the hearse arrives at the vault in Ross Bay cemetery the bugle will again sound a halt and the procession will remain at ease until the final rites are concluded.

The line of march will be along Menzies street to Belleville, around the Bay to Humboldt street, thence to Douglas, along Courtenay to the church, thence to Government street, to Fort, to Cook, Fairfield road and Ross Bay.

Carriages will form on Quebec street in the order laid down.
