dairy section finds a good market at Beaver Dam, whence the crops ar shipped to Milwaukee or Chicago, the latter point being only 149 miles dis tant. The means of communication with all parts of the country are an ple, as the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul R. R. system touches thi point, offering a highway in every direction through its numerous radiating branches and connections. Beaver lake is well stocked with game fish, the pickerel being especially notable for their immense size and superior flavor Last spring the state fish commission planted 140,000 young Mackina trout in its waters, which in a few years will arrive at sufficient maturit to delight the angler and adorn his camp larder.

RIPON.

A number of natural beauties, combining with advantages of situal tion and historical associations of no little interest, render the litt from city of Ripon, Wisconsin, a point of more than ordinary attraction, everiver among the many interesting places in this favored state. The city is si wan uated in the western part of Fond du Lac county, 83 miles from Milwat poin kee, at the point where the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul road diverge town to Oshkosh, the crossing of the Sheboygan and Fond du Lac R. R. 0 place the latter line, six miles west of Ripon, is Green Lake station, on the lal inter of the same name, long celebrated among the disciples of Izaak Walte facts for its magnificent fishing, and popular with the sportsmen of the count busin as well for the excellent duck and other shooting its neighborhood affor unsu The lake is irregular in form, and is about fifteen miles ites length, with an average width of three miles. Facilities for reaching the miles inviting spot from Ripon, are ample, by stage or by the trains over themiles Sheboygan and Fond du Lac road.

Ripon was incorporated a city in 1838, and has at the present time desci population of about 4,000. A considerable manufacturing interest latione sprung up and the local industries are in a thriving condition. There a mun flouring mills, wind mills, saw mills, carriage works, and a large pick trans factory in successful operation. The Ripon college, the result of loc capa enterprise on the part of Captain Mapes and other pioneers of the plac Wini is located here, and is a flourishing and popular educational institution The locality of Ripon will ever prove interesting to the student of sociolog inasmuch as it was at this spot that one of the most earnest and compr hensive, and for a time successful, efforts in history was made to establitown a social community in accordance with the theories of Fourier and others. philosophers of that ilk. Harmony Colony was established in 1834 or 183 and prospered so well that within a couple of years it had over three hu dred and fifty members. The families possessed everything in commo and their united efforts in the field of agriculture soon gave the communi an accumulation of property regarded in those days as considerable. people were frugal, industrious, temperate, law-abiding and religious, aleight so long as their position remained isolated they got on very well togeth
