THAT the general Ballance of Trade inflead of being 2,063,036 k 1.s. against us, at a Medium each Year of the first Period; is no less than 1,632,591 k. 19 s. 9 d. $\frac{1}{4}$ id our Favour each Year of the second. These two Ballances show that our general Trade was 3,695,528 k. o.s. 9 d $\frac{3}{4}$ per Annum, more to our Advantage in the second Period than in the first.
