The fault in my opinion is not with the saloon or hotel-keeper, but the manufacturer, as the keeper, but the manufacturer, as the former cannot adulterate the beer he receives. Now it must be greed on the brewers' part, as the present price of the goods is as high and in some cases higher than it was some years ago, when the quality was good and the raw material dearer than at present. The present price of barley is 40 cents per bushel, compared with formerly 60 cents to 65 cents; hops 10 to 12 cents per lb., formerly 20 cents; and malt, the duty on which was 2 cents, now 1 1-2 cents per lb. If the manufacturers don't want their business ruined, they had better use more malt and less substitutes.


