Ottawa, May 31.—(Special.)—In the Senate, Hon. Mr. Scott moved the second reading of the Plebiscite Bill.

Sir Mackenzie Bowell, while not opposing the bill, accused the Government of an attempt to shirk responsibility. Their attitude on the question made him believe the whole thing to be a broad farce. If the Ministers were not trying to humbug the people, they would say whether a majority of the votes polied or a majority of the votes would decide the question, and would assure the people that if the vote were favorable prohibition would be enacted.
