

By the passing of a majority vote of endorsation at their business meeting this week, the Woman's Club of Montreal led the way in a new movement in the city. A suggestion was made at the business meeting emanating from the Citizenship Committee of the Local Council of Women, indicating that the time had arrived when the women of Montreal might well consider the question of women's sufferage, and suggesting that the thirty-seven clubs affiliated to the council should form suffrage classes, at which the subject could be discussed and understood.

The Women's Club entered heartily into the suggestion and also approved of the local canvassers and take a portion of the clerical work, which will be involved in their determination that every woman in Mon treal possessing the municipal vote shall be made aware of the fact, and of the importance of her voting for good government. Working in harmony with the Citizens' Association, the various women's clubs will practically have the exclusive handling of the organization of the women's vote, and as this is anticipated as being upwards of 8,000, it will be seen that it will come as a very decided asset on the side of good government.
