SIR WILFRID LAURIER SAYS CANADA WILL BEGETTING SWING INTO LINE FOR NATIONAL EFFICE

In Stirring Address in House of Commons Premier Declares That British Supremacy is Necessary for Civilization and Peace

Canada Will Undertake the Defence of Her Coast and Build Her Own Navy—Willing to Make Any Sacrifice to Maintain the World Supremacy of the British Empire—The Last Man and the Last Dollar at the Service of Motherland

"I have no hesitation in saying that if the day should come when the supremacy of Britain on the high seas is challenged, it will be the duty of all the daughter nations to close around the old Motherland to ward off any attack."

Should that day come I would deem it my duty to devote what is left of my life and energy to stump the country and impress upon my compatriots, especially in Quebec, the absolute certainty that the salvation of England is the salvation of our own country—Sir Wilfrid Laurier.

Ottawa, March 29—In a crowded house, Canada's message of loyalty to the Empire was today voiced by the leader of both parties.

The debate, which was maintained on a high level of eloquence and characterized by glowing interludes of sentiment, was opened by Hon. G. E. Foster, who moved a resolution declaring that the time had come when Canada should assume her share of the burden of imperial defence.

Mr. Laurier declared Canada had already done much for the defence, and was prepared to do more, but the principle of autonomy, which was the basis of the British Empire, must be maintained.

Following the lines of the declaration made at the imperial conference of 1907, Canada had undertaken the organization of a small navy of submarines and torpedo boats, controlled by the dominion government.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

ANY person who is the sole owner of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, who has been a resident of the Dominion of Canada for one year, and who is a citizen of the Dominion of Canada, is entitled to apply for a grant of land.

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
