ANNUAL REPORT.

The President and Directors of the Halifax Protestant Industrial School submit herewith, for the information of subscribers and the general public, their Annual Report for 1900, together with the Financial Statement of the Treasurer, and a list of . cash subscriptions and other donations received during the year.

The number of boys on the register at beginning of the year was thirty-six, sent to us as follows:—Seven by sentence of County Court Judges from different sections of the Province, seven for truancy (short terms,) eleven placed in the Home by parents or interested friends, and eleven by sentence of the City Magistrate.

Thirty-one boys were admitted during the year and nineteen left, their time having expired.

The conduct of the boys during the year was good and the health of all was excellent. Not once during the year were the services of a physician required.

Physical Training.—Twice a week exercises in physical drill have been conducted by Sergt. Major Long, with most beneficial results in improved discipline, and in the well set up appearance of the boys physically. During the visit of the Educational
