Transient Newspapers and Periodicals Addressed to Places in Canada and United States.

On all Newspapers and Periodicals other than those from the Office of Publication, including all Newspapers and Periodicals published less frequently than once a month, the postage rate is one cent per four ounces in weight, which must be prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and Periodicals weighing less than one ounce may be posted singly if prepaid by postage stamp, one half cent each.

Newspapers posted for city delivery must be prepaid by one cent stamp

Transient Newspapers Addressed to GREAT BRITAIN.

Newspapers addressed to places in the United Kingdom must be prepaid by postage stamp Two cents per 4 oz., or fraction of 4 oz.

Book Packets and Patterns, or Samples of Merchandise, 2 cents per 2

ounces or fraction of 2 ounces.

PARCEL POST.

The Postage on Parcels addressed to places in Canada continue at former rates, which must be prepaid by postage stamp, viz :-

Not exceeding ½ lb. weight, 12½ cents. do. do. 37½ do. 13 do. do. 50 do. do. do.

And so on. Parcels intended to pass through the Mails should not exceed 4 pounds in weight or 24 inches in length, and should be marked "by Parcel Post." Parcels may be Registered by affixing a 5 cent Registered Letter Stamp thereto, in addition to the Postage.

MISCELLANEOUS POSTAL MATTER.

Books and Pamphlets, Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Hand Bills, Book and Newspaper Manuscript, Printers' Proofs, Maps and Prints, Engravings, Sheet Music, Photographs, Insurance Policies, Militia and School Returns, Seeds. Cuttings, Bulbs, Roots, &c.

CANADA AND UNITED STATES.

When posted addressed to any place in Canada or the United States, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of one cent per 4 ounces in weight, and Book Packets must be put up in wrappers OPEN AT BOTH ENDS. If put up in envelopes, only partially open at the ends, they will be treated as letters, and charged double letter rates of postage on delivery.

Post bands with an impressed one cent stamp, for this purpose, may be obtained at any stamp agency.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST.

Canada.

Patterns and samples of merchandise, when posted in Canada for places within Canada, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of One Cent per 4 ounces in weight, and put up in such a manner as to admit of inspection. Sample Packets may be Registered on affixing a 5 cent Registered Letter Stamp thereto, in addition to the Postage.

United States.

Patterns and samples of merchandise, posted for places in the United States, will continue to be subject to the special rate of 10 cents each, prepaid by postage stamp, and must not exceed 8 ounces in weight.
