

Copy Report re-Survey Fisher River Indian Reserve NO. 44.

Ottawa, March 28, 1911.

Sir,-

I beg to report on the Resurvey of the lots and survey of the road at FISHER RIVER as follows.

A base line was surveyed as shown in red on the plan, and each lot line run across the river and posts planted on the lot lines on each side of the River, Lots 123 to 130 inclusive, North of the River, and lots 151 to 160 inclusive South of Fisher River were added, as several people already had houses on these lands and wished an allotment surveyed where their houses were, so that they might farm without being molested by the members of the band. The eastern 2 miles of the 4 square miles, was also, subdivided. The lots are generally five chains in width lots 99, 100 and 101 were somewhat changed in the resurvey, and land occupied and previously surveyed by the Hudson's Bay Company, is now to be known as lot 100. The roads as surveyed are one chain in width and were run east and west from our Meridian and for the most part follows the trail. The road south of the river extends from the line between lots 77 and 78 to the May Lands, there being crossings made by taking one chain off part of lots 45 and 78 and a crossing made through lot 101. Between stations 31 and 32 stands the House of Councillor Harry Rastatak which will have to be moved at an estimated cost of fifty dollars if the road is constructed. A bridge will be required between stations 32 and 33 across Fisher River. It should be of sixty foot open span with a pier at each end and a forty foot approaches at the northern
