ished before the sundown limit owing to delays occasioned by a returned soldier's reception, which was held on the track and the race will be carried over into today's card. While it was not finished and had only four starters out of a field of nine, the heats were exciting and the time, which did not drop below 2.17%, was better than expected. The third heat, in which Vana held her feet practically the entire distance, was sufficiently fast to please even the pad-dock devotees the fractional time for the race being up to the half mile, the fastest of the day.
