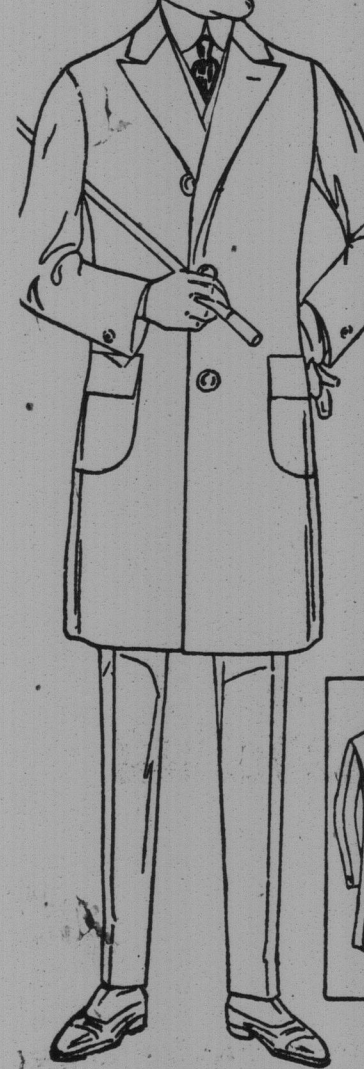

**WILLARD MAY NOT FIGHT THIS WINTER**

Chicago, Nov. 29.—If Jess Willard has his say about it, and it looks as if his manager will be guided to a great extent by the champion's wishes, he may not appear in a ring contest the coming winter at all.

What Willard wants to do is to remain idle for a couple of months at least and then enter a training siege that will put him in the very best of shape. After that, when the best man to box has been uncovered, he will be ready for him.

It is the champion's idea to box in the open air—this for several reasons. Not only does Jess believe that he can do himself greater justice in the open than he can in smoke filled halls, as Madison Square Garden was the night he boxed Moran, but he believes in admitting the public to his contests at a cheaper rate.

"If there was a sharp demand for a match I might listen to it," he said, "but there isn't any that I can hear just now. That's why I'd like to see the other fellows fight it out in the next three or four months and then let the public judge which one is best entitled to a match with me."

"One thing you can put down as certain. No more show business for me. Willard is relishing a little about Carl Morris and says if he could be shown that Morris would be a card anywhere he might consider a match with him. He was especially curious to know what progress Fulton has been making.

Tex Rickard held a long secret session with Willard yesterday, but neither would discuss the nature of the conference.
