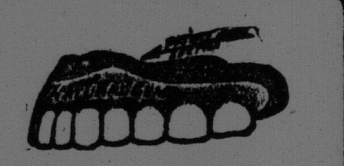

COMPANY MADE \$48,000 ON WAR CONTRACTS

Ottawa, March 29.—Before the public accounts committee today T. A. Russell of the Russell Motor Car Company and its subsidiary company, the Canada Cycle and Motor Company, Toronto, who looked after the purchase of motor transport and bicycles for the first contingent, was on the stand. He said that he made no personal profit and that the company's profit of \$48,000 on sales of \$400,000 was not more than a concern should expect to make on a government contract of that size. Regarding the statement of Major Thomas that \$180,000 had been saved by purchasing direct from manufacturers for the second contingent, Mr. Russell said that when the bills were all in the saving might be found to be only half that amount. He admitted that \$5,000 for an overcharge on tires had been refunded by his company after the auditor general had taken up the matter with them.
