### JEWISH FESTIVAL IS BROUGHT TO CLOSE

Observance Has Lasted For Eight Days-Services in Wellington Row Synagogue

The Jewish Feast of the "Chanuka" closed yesterday at sunset with services in the synagogue in Wellington Row. The feast has been observed by those of Jewish faith for the past eight days and commemorates the time when the Jews were successful in their ef-forts to retain religious freedom, at a time when an Assyrian king threatened the existence of all religion. This is the holiday when a new candle is lit on the first day and increased by one on each succeeding day until the last when eight candles are lit. memorate the return of the Jews to the temple. After the defilement of the temple by the Assyrians it was discovered that the Manaroh, in effect a large candelabra, holding seven candesticks, had sufficient oil in it to last one day. In order to carry out their religious practice they needed eight such casks of oil. Through a miracle the one cask remaining lasted eight days and it is in commemoration of this miracle that candles are burned on the Feast of Chanuka.
