REV. DR. JACKSON ON ENGLISH AFFAIRS

Says Higher Critics Have Won — The Question of Church Union.

(Toronto Globe.)
Rev. Dr. George Jackson, who about ten years ago was the storm-centre of a warm controversy in the Methodist

church of Canada, arrived in Toronto yesterday morning to fulfill an engagement to preach for eight Sundays in Eaton Memorial church. The fires of controversy have not only burnt down, but have been forgotten in the years of a more sanguinary conflict with the Feutons, and Dr. Jackson was greeted by a host of friends who assembled at the morning service to hear his first sermon. Dr. Jackson is a Scottish Methodist. As a preacher there is an urgency about his deliverance that reminds one of the saying of St. Paul, "Woe is me if I preach not." There is nothing of heresy about his teaching; his message is a plain and straight-out evangelistic one, which is at once forceful and persuasive. Glad to Revisit Toronto.

In the course of an interview with a representative of The Globe, Dr. Jackson expressed his pleasure in revisiting Toronto, and declared that his seven years' ministry in Canada was an experience which had broadened his horizon.

"I have never lost touch with Canada; my son is here and has become a Canadian, and during the war we frequently entertained Canadian soldiers in our home in London."

"Is there any danger of a revival of the old controversy on higher criticism?" asked The Globe.

"No; the battle of Old Testament criticism has been fought and won."

"By whom has it been won?"


Critics Win, He Says.

"Prof. Peake's commentary on the Bible was written from the critical point of view, and it is selling today by the hundreds of thousands for the use of preachers and Sunday school teachers. cial and passing one. So far as the churches are concerned the war seems to have stressed the question of union and the ecclesiastical temper has been changed. The Lambeth appeal was the result of the interdenominational activities during the war, and the close fellowship of ministers and men of various communions. They became impatient of distinction that had ceased to be real.

"What are the prospects of church union in Great Britain?"

"There is a growing movement for the union of all the Methodist churches, and union of the Presbyterian churches of Scotland will soon be consummated, but the union of Anglicans and nonconformists is not within one hundred miles of practical politics."

"What about the proposal for the interchange of pulpits?"

Depends Upon the Anglicans.

"That depends upon the Anglicans; we are ready for it at any time," said the doctor decisively. "I recently took part in an interdenominational service held in Manchester Cathedral. That would not have been possible ten years ago. But this can be stated for certain. There can be no union on the basis of episcopal ordination; it must be a union of churches as such. The air is full of friendly feeling, however."

Labor Government Coming.

In reply to a question regarding the social and political situation in England, Dr. Jackson said: "I believe there will be a labor government in England in the near future. Mr. Lloyd George is not

popular with the old friends; they recognize his priceless services during the war, but they feel that the present situation is unreal. England today is practically under a one-man government. But Lloyd George is a marvelous man and he seems to thrive on crises. His nimble-wittedness is wonderful. The government's policy in Ireland has had much to do with the antipathy of the prime minister. I believe parties are willing to give the Irish all they ask for—except separation."
