N. S. MAN MISSING AFTER COLLISION

Vessels Crash in Hurricane—Trawlers Lost in the Atlantic.

Prince Rupert, B. C., Oct. 15—The steamer James Carruthers collided with the United States steamship Surveyor in a hurricane on Tuesday night, off Green Island. The Surveyor, a much larger vessel, was carrying seventy-four men from Alaska. The impact put the Carruthers in a sinking condition. Four men are missing from the Carruthers. They are James Mansfield, Newfoundland; Alex. Murray, Nova Scotia; C. Kerr Scotland, and George Anderson, Norway.

Narrow Escape.

Halifax, N. S., Oct. 15—Boisterous weather on the Atlantic has wrought havoc to the latest flotilla of trawlers and drifters which left this port on last Sunday. Two trawlers and three drifters sailed for Inverness, Scotland. One of the trawlers returned yesterday and reported the loss of two of the drifters, the crews of which were saved. The other trawler was last seen heading for Sydney with the third drifter in tow. The crews of the two lost drifters had a narrow escape, one crew being rescued as the ship's decks were awash. The drifter sank ten minutes later. There were eight men on each of the drifters. High seas had swept over the boats and extinguished the fires.

FIRST MONUMENT TO THE MEMORY OF SIR WILFRID

Montreal, Oct. 15—The unveiling of the first monument to the memory of Sir Wilfrid Laurier, erected in the province of Quebec, will take place at Iteville on next Monday, when Lady Laurier has promised to attend to unfurl the flag.

The monument is the work of Louis Sorbonne, a Montreal sculptor, and will be erected in the public park at the foot of the Gouin bridge. It is the gift of the population of the surrounding districts. Speakers attending will include Sir Lomer Gouin, Hon. R. Lemieux, Hon. L. O. David and Hon. Henri Mercier.

QUEBEC APPOINTS A FUEL ADMINISTRATOR
