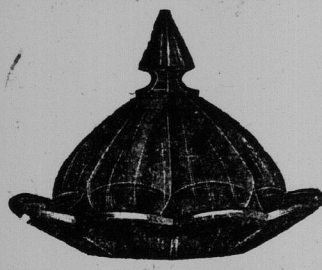
MADAME JACQUEMAIRE HAS FAITH IN FRANCE

Premier's Daughter Gave Her 18-Year Son to His Country—Saw Great Service Herself

(Toronto Mail and Empire)
Madame Clemenceau, daughter of Premier Clemenceau of France, is herself a heroine of the war. Her only son, 18 years of age, she gave to the war, and he has returned from it with a terribly wounded arm. Not content with this sacrifice she offered herself, and being accepted, served from 1914 until the day the armistice was signed, in the hospitals and dressing stations of the forward area. Like her famous father, she has deserved well of her country, and it has shown its appreciation of her courage and her untiring devotion to the cause, by conferring upon her the Croix de Guerre with star and palm, one of the highest and most coveted decorations of the French army. The ribbon of this, together with the ribbon of another medal which she earned some years ago for her work during the typhus epidemic which raged through France, she wears on the left breast of her costume. Though the war is over, she is still serving her country. It is to cement more closely the bonds which have been wrought between the Anglo-Saxon and the French races during the war, that she is in this country. Like her father, Madame Jacquemaire is intensely patriotic. She thinks France, like France, and she believes in France. Although her visits in the United States are fatigued her greatly, she was not so tired to talk for more than half an hour last night on the problems and aims of France to the representative of the Mail and Empire who called to see her. She speaks English quite well, slowly, at first, but then when she finds her word now and then when she finds her English inadequate to give full expression to her thoughts.

Work of Reconstruction.
She spoke for some minutes on the manner in which France is reconstructing her ravaged territory. To what used to be the forward areas nearly all the people who are alive have returned. From the army huts, or from what material the war-stricken areas contain they have constructed temporary dwellings which they are using until more permanent homes can be built. The land is being filled in and much of it is now under cultivation. Much difficulty is being found in dividing the property as it stood in pre-war days. In the majority of cases all the records and deeds have been lost or destroyed, and in making new surveys the officials have to depend almost entirely upon the statements of the owner, substantiated by his friends. Where this work cannot be done quickly community farming has been established, all working a common piece of property and all sharing in the harvest. In this connection Madame Jacquemaire pointed out that the problem which is causing her father much concern is the question of the burial grounds. Such huge tracts of ground have been appropriated for this purpose that it is a difficult question to decide how the former owners of that land can be compensated for their loss. No definite policy has been decided upon yet, but the large land-owners may come to the aid of the government by offering portions of their property to indemnify those whose farms are now the resting-place of the dead.

ions. But she expressed the hope that Premier Clemenceau would stand by the decision he made before she left France, to refuse the presidency of the republic. She feels that he has finished his task, and that he has earned the right to rest. Once the railways and canals and other means of transportation can be restored to normal Madame Jacquemaire thinks France will show the same recuperative powers which marked her recovery from the war of 1870. At the present moment many of her industries are paralyzed for lack of coal, although huge stocks of coal are lying on the docks at Le Havre and other ports. This is entirely due to the fact that transportation is lacking. A great deal of work is being done on the railways, however, and Madame Jacquemaire expects to see France start on the high road of success within the next year.
