WILL OF MRS. POTTER PALMER

It Makes Bequests of Twenty Million Dollar Estate.

\$515,000 Goes to Charities—Sons Receive Bulk in Trust for Their Children; \$100,000 in Art to Chicago Institute; Legacies to Servants

Chicago, May 21.—The will of the late Mrs. Potter Palmer, affecting the disposal of an estate valued at more than \$20,000,000, has been filed for probate. The bulk of the estate is handed down in trust to the two sons, Honore Palmer and Potter Palmer, Jr.; the sum of \$515,000 is bequeathed to various charitable organizations, and Mrs. Palmer's collection of paintings, to the value of \$100,000, is given to the Art Institute. Mrs. Palmer's personal estate is estimated to be worth \$10,000,000. The balance, amounting to about \$20,000,000, was held in trust by Mrs. Palmer from her husband's estate. When Potter Palmer died sixteen years ago his estate was estimated at \$8,000,000, so that in the intervening time, under his widow's management, it has more than doubled in value.

The two sons during their lifetime are to enjoy the income from the vast estate, and upon their deaths the income is to go to their children, until the eldest son shall reach the age of twenty-one years. Then the whole Palmer fortune is to be divided among the Palmer grandchildren, of whom there are seven. Honore and Potter Palmer, Jr., are directed by their mother to expend \$400,000 for the aid of such philanthropic or educational institutions as they may select.

To the United Charities \$100,000 is left; to the Children's Memorial Hospital and Chicago Commons, \$10,000 each, and \$5,000 to the Legal Aid Society.

To the two daughters-in-law, Mrs. Grace Brown Palmer and Mrs. Pauline Kohlman Palmer, the sum of \$100,000 each is left outright.

No mention is made of Mrs. Lockwood Honore, widow of Mrs. Palmer's brother, who died last summer. Loop property to the value of \$15,000,000, including the Palmer House, is placed in the trust, which the two sons will have in charge. In addition, Mrs. Potter Palmer had 70,000 acres of Florida land near Sarasota, Manatee county, and near Tampa. The part on which Mrs. Palmer's southern home stood is given to the two sons. Near Tampa, 10,000 acres additional are given to the two sons. A. C. Honore, her brother, receives 15,000 acres. The rest of the Florida property is placed in a trust over which A. C. Honore is made trustee for the benefit of his brother, Nathaniel M. Honore, and his sister, Mrs. Ida Honore Grant, widow of General Frederick Dent Grant, son of the former president.

To her secretary, Mrs. Pauline Furman, \$8,000 is left; to her butler, Ernest Woods, \$5,000; to "George Marshall of England, my former footman," \$3,000. Legacies to the Palmer servants aggregated \$80,000.

The Palmer mansion on the Lake Shore Drive, together with all art collections, rugs, paintings, and the bric-a-brac, is given outright to the two sons. Mrs. Palmer in her will directs her sons to collect from the art objects in her home any group in their discretion which will equal in value \$100,000 and present it to the Art Institute. In the Palmer galleries are works of Monet, Manet, Degas, Bonnard, and Renoir. In addition Mrs. Palmer had three-score canvases by American painters and modern Europeans. George Inness, Charles H. Davis, Alexander Harrison, Eastman Johnson, Henry S. Mowbray, Garf Melchers, Anders Zorn, and Munkacsy all contributed to her collection.

Alfred Morrissey, 59 Hazen street, has received word that his son, Henry, has arrived safely in England. He has joined the Royal navy.


He was born in St. John. He was thirty-six years old and a dentist by profession. George Bell, a local druggist, is a brother.
