Hints for the Cook

Lemon Pie

One cup hot water, 2 egg yolks, 1/2 cup sugar, small piece of butter, 1 teaspoon lemon extract, 1 teaspoon cream of tartar, 2 tablespoons cornstarch. Egg whites for frosting.

Cocoa Pudding

Mix 2 heaping tablespoons of cocoa, 1/4 cup of sugar and a little salt. Add 1 pint of milk, bring to a boil and thicken with 2 tablespoons of cornstarch dissolved in a little cold water. Add 1 teaspoonful of vanilla and pour into baking dish to cool before putting on meringue. Beat the whites of 2 eggs very stiff, add 1 tablespoonful sugar and drop in spoonfuls or "islands" on top. of each island sprinkle coconut and a little sprinkle of sugar. Put in the oven until a delicate brown.

Creamed Peach Tapioca

Cook 1 heaping tablespoon of tapioca (the kind that requires no soaking) in 2 pints of milk in double boiler about 15 minutes. Take 4 or 5 peaches, peel and cut in pieces. Put into buttered pudding dish; add the stones to give better flavor. Beat 1 egg, add 2 heaping tablespoons of salt and stir into the milk. Remove at once from the fire and pour over the peaches. Bake in moderate oven till peaches are done (about 1/2 hour). Good hot or cold.

The waist is developed in that most fashionable of blouse materials, crepe Georgette. The vest and major part of the collar are of black and white striped silk. Note the odd finish of the sleeves, the shirring forming a cuff effect with a self-ruffle at the top. The material required to make the waist is as follows:

3/4 yards 44-inch crepe at \$1 yard..... \$2.35
1/2 yard 2-inch webbing for belt at 5c..... .25
1/2 yard 1/2-inch striped taffeta for vest and collar..... .35
Total..... \$2.95

PROHIBITS AUSTRIANS
FROM LEAVING CANADA

Ottawa Government Issues Order to Arrest Any Attempting to do so—Those Who Pursue Their Avocations Shall not be Interfered With so Long as They Observe the Laws and Proclamations.

Ottawa, Aug. 16.—Following England's declaration of war on Austria last week, an order-in-council has been passed forbidding the departure from Canada of Austrian reservists.

The order-in-council states that Austro-Hungarians so long as they quietly pursue their ordinary avocations shall not be arrested, detained or interfered with, unless there is reasonable ground to believe that they are engaged in espionage, or attempting to engage in acts of a hostile nature, or to give information to the enemy or unless they otherwise contravene any law, order-in-council or proclamation.

"All Austro-Hungarian officers or reservists attempting to leave Canada at any port on the Atlantic or on the Pacific shall be arrested and detained."

"Precautions shall be taken at all important points such as Halifax, St. John, Quebec, Montreal, Kingston, Toronto, Niagara, Hamilton, London, Windsor, Sarnia, Sault Ste. Marie, Port Arthur, Fort William, Winnipeg, Regina, Moose Jaw, Calgary, Lethbridge, Revelstoke,

Sicamous, Mission Junction, New Westminster, Vancouver, Victoria and any other similar points in the discretion of the minister of militia, to prevent Austro-Hungarian officers or reservists from leaving Canada for the purpose of entering the military service of Austria-Hungary, and any such officers or reservists making any such attempt shall be arrested and detained."

ONE LIFE LOST AND TWO
PAINFULLY INJURED WHEN
MOTOR BOAT EXPLODED

James Dunlavy lost his life, it is feared, and Frank Craft and Frank Dymman were painfully injured in the explosion of the gasoline tank on the motor boat Alto owned by Mr. Dunlavy, in the harbor last night about eleven o'clock. Some gasoline in the bottom of the boat caught fire and the three jumped into the water. A few minutes later the tank exploded and that was the last seen of Dunlavy. The other two men, painfully burned about the face, were rescued by James Keefe and taken to

the west side where their injuries were attended by Dr. J. L. Duval. Mr. Dunlavy was about 46 years old and unmarried.
