Swindlers in London Get Easy Money. CONFIDENCE TRICKS. Larger Number of Sick Thieves in Empire Metropolis This Year Than Usual so Early in Season—Scotland Yard Men Have Net Out.

London, May 26—Within the last few days three visitors from overseas dominions have been the victims of "confidence tricks" in the West End of London, and during the last month the authorities of Scotland Yard have received notification of a large influx of foreign criminals.

A Scotland official said that London is a happy hunting ground for "confidence tricks" every summer. They come here annually at the beginning of the season, when the bulk of the visitors from America are arriving.

When a swindler is recognized either in the bar or in the lounge of a hotel, the manager is quickly informed of the type of man who is staying at his house, and that night the suspect is asked to move his belongings and clear out.

"We had a peculiar case a few months ago," said the Scotland Yard official. "A South African gentleman who was on a visit here after touring the world, lost \$2,000 through a confidence trick, but for business reasons he wished the case to remain secret."

When inquiries were started a most amazing story was unfolded, showing that the victim had been tracked from his home around the world by the two swindlers. Only when they reached London did the opportunity they were waiting for appear, and it was a consolation to the victim that he had not been induced to give more money, as he expected a bigger haul after their exit.
