

INCREASE 'PHONE RATES

Vancouver, B. C., Dec. 25—Rates in Victoria and Vancouver for all business telephones will be increased \$1 a month, beginning March 1. The charge for residence telephones will not be affected.

This is the decision of the board of directors of the British Columbia Telephone Company, after discussing the recent decision of the board of concillation which decided in favor of an increase of twenty-five cents a day in the wages of the company's linemen The increase in linemen's wages will go into effect on January 1.

The rental of business telephones is now \$4 a month if the account is paid before the 18th day of each month, otherwise it is \$5.


