

ON SOAP, IN RELATION TO THE COMPLEXION. FROM AN ARTICLE BY DR. ANDREW WILSON, F.R.S.E., Lecturer on Health under the "Combe Trust;" Lecturer on Physiology at the Edinburgh University; Editor of "Health."
