Financial success attended the operations of the Temiskaming and Northern Ontario Railway, under the control of the Ontario government, for the year ended October 21, last. According to a statement credited by an evening paper to Commissioner George Lee, of the T. and N. O. R. Commission, the profits during the past year were about \$250,000 in excess of the previous year's profits.

AT ST. JOHN WITH RE-DUCED WAGE STANDARDS.

The Atlantic Sugar Refinery in St. John, N.B., after having been closed down about three months, resumed operations on Monday. It is expected the re-opening of the refinery will absorb about 400 of the city's unemployed. The men return to work under new conditions. Before the shut down they were working on three shifts a day at 47 certs an hour. It is understood the new conditions call for two shifts a day at 35 cents an hour.


