> Ottawa, Jan. 20.-In a return placed on the table of the House there are ome interesting information and suggestive figures. The existence of the mint to-day is due almost wholly to the demand originating in British Columbia, which with the Yukon, produces most of the precious and other metals that will be used in making the coinage of Canada, that is gold, silver, copper and nickel, it being in con-templation to issue a nickel piece of five cents value.

As Canada is the largest producer of nickel in the world it will be a very proper thing to advertise the coun-try's mineral wealth by utilizing that valuable metal in the production of a oin that will be of such common use as a five-cent piece.
