A VALUABLE COW PASTURE

The Difference Which General Election Can Make in Price of Real Estate — A Moncton Case.

Moncton, Aug. 26.—Cow pasture and swamp lands are very valuable in the vicinity of Moncton. The county records show that the Hon. H. R. Emerson as trustee of Hannah Spurr received \$14,221 for a property at Moncton sold to his majesty the King and transferred December 17th, 1910, and a further sum of \$7,000 for property, also at Moncton, transferred on April 1st of this year.

The first amount of \$14,221 was for land taken for the I.C.R. cut off from a point near Hall's Creek to the new shops. This land skirts Hall's Creek and is largely a swamp and partly submerged marsh, having little or no commercial value.

Whether the government gets rent for this pasture or the cows belong to some favorite and get free feed does not appear, but it is known that \$8,000 of the amount received by Mr. Emerson's friend went into the election fund.
