WILL AMERICAN
LINERS DISPENSE
THIRST QUENCHERSLegal Dept. of Shipping Board
to Decide—Meantime Bar
Fixtures Are Being Install-
ed on Leviathan.

Washington, D. C., Nov. 27.—Whether constitutional prohibition will operate to make American passenger liners "dry" has been referred to the legal department of the shipping board for a decision. Meantime bar fixtures are being installed on the giant liner Leviathan which is to be operated between New York and England. Shipping board officials explained today that it would be nearly a year before this great craft would be ready for operation. Within a few months, however, former German liners are to be placed in the South American passenger trade and a decision on the question is expected before that time.

Addressed Members
Of Canadian ClubMajor D. King Hazen Delivered
Interesting Address
Last Evening on "The Al-
lied Venture Into Siberia."

Major D. King Hazen, son of Sir Douglas Hazen, chief justice, delivered a most interesting address to the Canadian Club at Bond's last night, taking as his subject "The Allied Venture Into Siberia."

In introducing the speaker, Vice-President A. M. Belding, made passing reference to the work that had been done by the Allies in Russia and by the Canadian contingent in particular.

The speaker, who was received with applause and said he had gone to Siberia with the first Canadian Expeditionary force early in 1918, with a handful of Canadians and there met conditions which were out of the regular run, to say the least.

They found the towns and villages in Siberia much after a pattern of the homes in France and Flanders, and in many cases the average peasant had a more comfortable life of it than his less fortunate compeer in France.

Particularly interesting was his description of the Siberian contingent that was attached to the Allied forces. Those fighters had travelled from the far south of Russia right through to the north, and every bit of country they passed was hostile territory.

They had proved great soldiers, as was proved from the way they disposed of several key points in connection with the arrest of a Checo Bolshevik.

Major Hazen gave several amusing anecdotes regarding the manner in which decorations were won by staff officers on the Siberian frontier, not the least interesting being that of the general staff officer in charge at Sargachi, who would not countenance a certain military bit of strategy and then accepted the distinguished service order when the expedition proved a success.

The speaker said that all the "outside" troops were glad to leave Russia, but he was of the opinion that with the Bolshevik forces gaining strength, there will not be much mercy handed out to the peasants and other natives who showed any favor to the Allied army of occupation.

COMMON COUNCIL
MET IN COMMITTEEDecided to Recommend That
Heated Gear Shed be Erect-
ed at Sand Point—Other
Business Transacted.

The common council in a short committee meeting in the mayor's office yesterday morning, decided to recommend to the council that a heated gear shed be erected at West St. John between No. 5 and No. 6 sheds at a cost of \$700.

Commissioner Bullock announced that he had a request from the Furness Withy & Co., Ltd., for this accommodation for which they offered an annual rental of \$100, and he moved that the committee recommend the erection of the shed, the cost to be paid for by bond issue, and that tenders be called for the work. This was carried. He explained that the shed would be 13 by 16 feet and would be used for the storage of ropes, gears and tackle used by the stevedores.

The mayor announced that the resolutions passed by the council recently with regard to harbor commission had been forwarded to Ottawa for the purpose of ascertaining if the conditions as to bounds and limits, as well as ferry reservations, etc., met with the views of the government. He expected to have a reply soon, when the matter could be further advanced towards the taking of a plebiscite on the question.

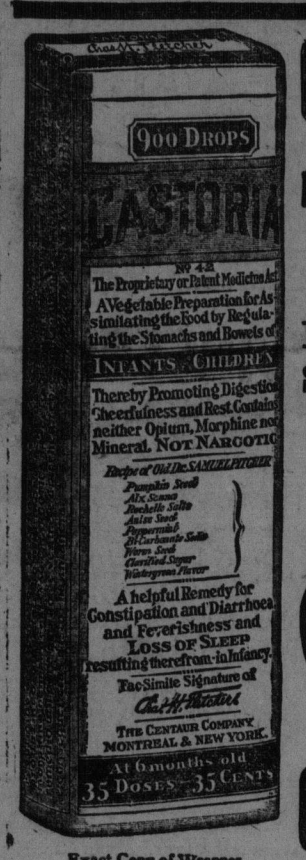
