EDUCATED ALIEN LEARNS DAY LABORER EARN MOST

Dominick Simone, Holding Two Degrees from Italian University, Is Accused of Beating Wife and Tells Why He Works as Plasterer's Helper.

New York, Feb. 16—Dominick Simone, of 20 North Henry street, Astoria, a plasterer's helper, was before Magistrate Conway in the Long Island City police court yesterday. The court was told by the magistrate that the man had said he held two degrees from an Italian university, that he was apparently a man of refinement, and that he was much above the average in intelligence.

"What is the charge against him?" the magistrate asked.

"Beating his wife," said the inter-
viewer.

Mrs. Simone, who is living with her
husband at 15 Franklin street, East
End Flats, told the court her husband
had struck her in the face, and that
she did not want to live with him be-
cause he had another wife in Italy.

Magistrate Conway asked Simone
if he knew that one of the things he would
earn in this country was that a man
is supposed to support his wife and
children and is not supposed to beat
them. He ordered Simone to pay his
wife \$8 a week, which the man agreed
had sent him money with which to

come to the United States. He said
he was educated in the "Sacred Heart
College" in Italy, and afterward went
to "the university" where he got his
degree. He was then, he said, made
an inspector of schools and teacher
inches, but joined the army when
the war began and served five years
being wounded twice.

"I am not a criminal," he said, "I decided
to come to this country to better my
self, and this woman's father sent me
money to come. But I found that he
