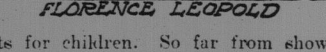

Will Take Place as Soon as Latter Recovers from a Beating by Former's Friends.

North Sydney, Sept. 11.—From private advisers received today from St. Pierre, it is learned that the editor of the *Journal* is in a state of some uneasiness, owing to the correspondence with awards between two prominent figures in the public life of the French colony. One is Dr. Dupuz, chief of the *Journal*, and the other Mr. Mazier-editor of the *Reveille*. St. Pierre's newspaper, over an article in the *St. Pierre's* some time ago in which the latter had been severely criticised, among these coming under the editor's list was Dr. Dupuz. Shortly after the article appeared four or five days later, the editor of the *Reveille* came to the home of the editor who is a man of about 55 years of age and gave him a severe reprimand, saying that he was not to be satisfied with his usual work, but he was still to be a man of letters. He then, afterwards summoned to appear in court, but as Mr. Mazier is too ill to appear the case was adjourned until the 15th inst.
