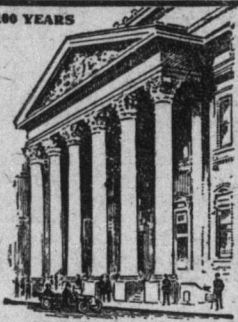

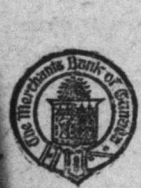

### QUEEN OF BELGIUM IS GIFTED WOMAN

Is Doctor of Medicine, Has Written Books, Can Repair Cars

Queen Elizabeth, of Belgium, in addition to being very human, is also a practical woman, always willing to do something for her people, and that, as much as anything else, endears her in the hearts of the people of Belgium, writes H. DeWissen, in the Forum.

She inherited a skill in medicine from her father, the Bavarian duke, and was his assistant during 6,000 operations, during which he removed cataracts from patients' eyes. Only a few years before her marriage to King Albert she took her degree as a doctor of medicine at the University of Leipzig. She is the chief physician to her husband and children. The King cannot plead a headache to escape a function, he says, because the Queen always doctors him up.

Queen Elizabeth is also an enthusiastic motorist, and can repair a car. One day when she and the King were motoring unattended, one of the tires blew out. King Albert knew nothing about machinery, and his wife tucked her skirt around her and soon had the repair made. The Queen is also a student of literature, and has published books and essays on a variety of subjects, mostly scientific.

### SIX NECESSARY AIRSHIPS WILL COST \$3,750,000 EACH

Mooring Posts Take Form of High Tower with Elevator Shaft

London.—The proposed Liverpool-New York air service will be an enormous undertaking. The problem of supplying the necessary dirigible airships is but one of the items to be considered. They cost about \$3,750,000 each to construct. At least six of these huge craft will be necessary to maintain these two services with any degree of regularity.

There are also to be considered the problems of suitable landing grounds and mooring-posts; the intention of the Great Northern Aerial Syndicate being that aerodromes will be provided at the more important stations, while mooring posts will serve as second-class stops or halts.

Aerodromes for dirigibles are required only at every 2,000 miles and it is now possible for an airship to be moored to or released from a mooring tower in any wind up to 60 miles an hour; yet the total financial backing considered necessary for such an undertaking is in the neighborhood of \$10,000,000.

The mooring out station for airships which is in the form of a high tower enclosing an elevator shaft by which passengers and cargo will be taken up and down from the ground is over 150 feet high. With a revolving head the airship can be rigidly attached to this tower by the nose, will rise clear of the ground in all weathers, and be able to swing with the direction of the wind.

Each of these towers will be provided with a hauling-in winch and a rope by which the airship will be hauled up to the mooring post; also a supply base of hydrogen, fuel and water ballast.

### FINGER PRINT SYSTEM ORIENTAL DISCOVERY.

The finger print system that sleuths all over the world have successfully used in catching desperate criminals was the invention of Orientals, either Chinese or Japanese, according to Filippo de Filippi, writing on Nature. The discovery was originally credited to Sir W. Herschel, in a parliamentary blue book, but Kumagusu Minakata, a Japanese proved the case for the East. No one on the controversy quoted Rashid-ud-din, who wrote about the system in use in Cathay even in his way. It was a finger print system of a sort, although not like that in use today. There was no blackening of the hands prior to the taking of the impression, but rather the hand was placed on paper and traced by the person taking the print. The hands of contracting parties were always placed on deeds in those days.

De Filippi says that this ancient system is worthy of investigation today, as study of the drawings shows a distinct difference in the outlines of fingers of the hands of different individuals, in the length of the fingers, the relative distance from one another, and the angle made by the axis of the thumb
