Work for the Gazette is mostly volunteer, and most people try a little of everything. If your interests are not yet defined, come in and expose yourself to all facets of newspaper production.

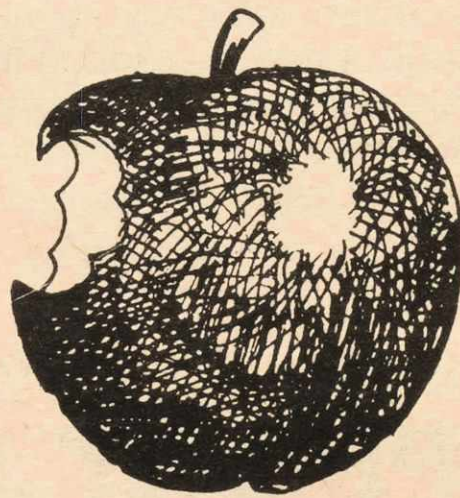
