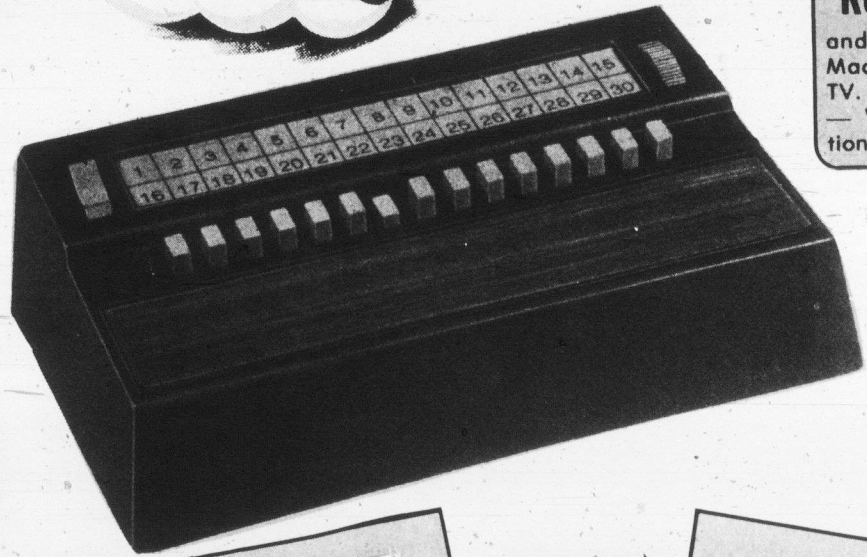
Erindale shellacked Port Credit 6-1 as Gary Parker and Paul Burley paced Erindale with two goals each.
