

9 area grads of York's Atkinson College

TORONTO — Six area students graduated from Atkinson College of York University this spring, twice as many as graduated in the fall of 1969. The spring graduates were: Joseph N. Atkinson College of York University is distinctive in that it has a full-time faculty devoted to the needs of part-time students. Now in its ninth academic year, the College conducts degree programs leading to Bachelor of Arts (ordinary), Bachelor of Arts (honours) and Bachelor of Arts (honours administration) degrees.

Enrollment during the past year has been over 7,000 students from all walks of life. They range from elder mature students planning new careers on retirement to students straight from the secondary schools who are taking up full-time employment and wish to continue their education at the university level.

Evening classes for part-time students are conducted on both the York Campus and the Glendon Campus, and this coming session day-time classes will be offered on the Glendon Campus for those who cannot attend in the evenings. In addition, Atkinson part-time students may now attend the regular day-time courses offered by Glendon College.

Admission requirements for Atkinson College are the same as those for the day programs of the University. Special consideration, however, is given to applicants who, while not having completed the published Grade XIII requirements, apply for admission as mature students. Such applicants must have reached the age of 23 years on the first of May of the year in which they apply.

While the majority of Atkinson students are pursuing programs leading to the ordinary Bachelor of Arts degree, the College also now offers honors programs of 20 courses.

The establishment of a Glendon Division of the College this autumn marks the dramatic growth of Atkinson since its first session with 244 students in 1962-63. This year with a planned enrollment of over 9,000 students, a full-time faculty of over 65 distinguished scholars, supported on a part-time basis by an experienced body of tutors and lecturers from the universities and the community, Atkinson has justified the concept upon which it was founded. Since then, three hundred and eighty part-time students of the college have been granted the Bachelor of Arts degree by York University. This year, an Atkinson student won a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship, the first person to do so through part-time study.

The Glendon Division is to be established this year in co-operation with Glendon College whose full-time faculty will be teaching Atkinson students on the same basis as the day students. They will conduct both day and evening classes which will be open to both Glendon and Atkinson students. These courses will be in addition to the Atkinson evening courses already scheduled for the A/W 1970-71 session.

Classes will begin on Sept. 21 and the last date for the receipt of applicants for admission of new students is August 1.
