This year with a planned enrolment of over 9,000 students, a full-time faculty of over 65 distinguished scholars, supported on a part-time basis by an experi-enced body of tutors and lecturers from the universities lecturers from the universities and the community, Atkinson has justified the concept upon which it was founded. Since then, three hundred and eighty part-time students of the college have been granted the Bachelor of Arts degree by York University. 


