to me & here will be over. I am not going to this
as a sight see but as a student, though no
doubt I shall see a good deal too. Surely
it would bring for me to waste my time at
Lund for three weeks at least longer.
One month will have been quite enough for
study & holiday & I feel I ought to be doing
some serious work. I might, however, be able
to arrange to meet you somewhere for some
part of a week about the 10th or 11th of June
