
Sir,-

Referring to your letter of the 12th ultimo I beg to inform you that in the reply received from Mr. W. R. Boucher, Superintendent of the G. N. Rwy., Sudbury, he says,-

"Some years ago there were a number of cattle killed at this crossing, but of late years the people on the reserve have kept their cattle fenced in better.  
"The crossing referred to is equipped with the Standard wooden cattle guards - The Spur leading to the gravel pit and the pit has never been fenced and I have arranged to have a gate put on where this spur comes on to the right-of-way instead of cattle guards, and this I think will give better protection and eliminate any further trouble at this point."

It is hoped that the cattle guards will give sufficient protection in the future at the crossing in the Garden River Indian reserve referred to and that the spur does not require fencing as stated by Mr. Boucher.
