What can be done is to announce the establishment of the administrative machinery, whether a new department of reconstruction or national development, or a planning board, or other agency, empowered to see that such projects are being planned and organized. The scope of the development agency can be spelled out and should be wide. While it should not attempt all the planning itself, it should have a supervisory authority over public works, water, forest and soil conservation, rural electrification, housing and community planning, the improvement of transportation facilities and tourist amenities, mining development, the extension of research and its application to both primary and secondary industries, and the conversion of war industries to civilian production. The success of its efforts will depend largely upon the evolution of satisfactory means of practical co-operation with the provinces and no time should be lost in developing the machinery of effective co-operation.

## Demobilization.

Planning for full employment is intimately related to the problem of demobilizing and re-establishing the armed forces. Consideration might be given to the consolidation of all the orders-in-council and statutes
