It is not easy to say how much of this is for Canada's direct war effort and how much is for Britain and her Allies, but the figures that have been taken out suggest that much more than helf of the production of war materials taking place in Canada is for Britain and our other Allies.

It was realized from the outset that Canada's greatest contribution might well be in the form of industrial production.
