

- A. Between 4 & 5 cell blocks. There was quite a number of staff there at that time.
- Q. Where were you standing? In line?
A. I was standing so I could look along the front of the cell blocks.
- Q. Was the accused alone?
A. There was a number of SUS there but he did come down off the parade square and he went into the cell.
- Q. Where was he when you first saw him?
A. On the parade square. He was less than 100 feet away from me. I didn't see him until he came off the parade square.
- Q. Whereabouts did he come off the parade square?
A. Just in front of #6 cell block.
- Q. He would be 50 feet away from you?
A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. Were there other SUS around him?
A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. Did you recognize any of the other SUS?
A. No, Sir.
- Q. Were you looking particularly for the accused?
A. No, Sir. Why I noticed him was that he was out of my hut.
- Q. Are you swearing on oath that he was the only one out of your hut?
A. No, Sir, I wouldn't swear to that. He was the only one that I saw out of my hut. There could have been more than him but I didn't see them.
- Q. Where was he in relation to the other SUS?
A. Three or four feet away from them.
- Q. In the middle of the group?
A. There were other SUS around him.
- Q. Were there other SUS between you and the accused?
A. They were moving back and forwards.
- Q. You say you saw them going into the cell block?
A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. Did you actually see them go in?
A. Yes, I stepped along and watched.
- Q. Did you see any of the staff attempt to stop them?
A. They were there before we got there.
- Q. Did any of the staff try to stop them?
A. I couldn't say.
- Q. Which end of the cell block is the entrance door?
A. The right hand side facing the living huts.
- Q. Is it the east or west end of the cell block?
A. West side.
- Q. How wide would you say the cell block was?
A. I don't know, Sir.
- Q. Approximate idea?
A. I didn't look in the cell block, Sir.
